Summary

Full-time position in an established group practice in the Denver metro-area. Candidates must have strong experience and interest in conducting neuropsychological/psychoeducational evaluations with children and teenagers. We specialize in conducting a range of evaluations, including assessments of cognitive, learning, and attentional disorders (e.g., Dyslexia, ADHD), executive functioning difficulties, and neuro-developmental conditions (e.g., ASD). Having expertise in conducting evaluations in all of these areas is not required; however, the candidate must have expertise in at least one area and be open to receiving training in the other areas. The candidate must also have substantial training and experience in therapy with children, teenagers, and parents/families.

Primary Job Activities

Evaluation

- Conduct developmental and diagnostic interviews.
- Administer a range of neuropsychological, developmental, and psychoeducational tests.
- Collaborate with parents, teachers, and other professionals throughout the evaluation process.
- Write thorough but concise evaluation reports that are very well-edited and provide clear and actionable recommendations for each family.
- Educate families on diagnoses and evidence-based treatments, as well as provide referrals.
- Work with families to advocate for their children in the office and in the field, including visits to schools and collaboration with other professionals.

Therapy

- Support clients and their families through therapy by assessing their clinical needs while integrating thoughtfully conceptualized and flexibly implemented evidence-based approaches.
- Collaborate with the client's existing care team, including school personnel and other allied professionals working with the client.

Job Competencies

- Either hold a current doctoral degree from an accredited program of Psychology (Ph.D. or Psy.D.), or be in the process of completing the full year APA accredited internship by the start of the position. This position can provide post-doctoral training and supervision toward licensure.
- Maintain strong familiarity with the DSM-5, evidence-based tools for assessment and diagnosis, and evidence-based approaches to intervention and treatment.
- Have the ability to communicate verbally and in writing in a clear and concise way.
- Exhibit strong and flexible problem-solving skills, to facilitate clinical decision-making.
- Be able to work collaboratively with peers and professionals, both within our office and among professionals from various disciplines in the community.

Work Environment

The majority of the responsibilities will take place at the Wolff Child Psychology office in Denver. Other duties may require travel to schools, service providers, and other settings. Telehealth services are also an option, and at times may be required for some clients and situations.
